Capital of three of the longest-lived empires in history.

Throughout the ages, Istanbul has been the capital of three of the longest-lived empires in history and a center for monotheistic beliefs. For centuries, Istanbul served as the capital of many cities which today are capitals in their own right.

Such a long experience enabled Istanbul to design a sui generis concept of cosmopolitanism.

This design protected not just those who lived in a specific territory but also the identities of scattered populations who did not even share a common language. Today, the world and its dynamics are different. But Istanbul has retained its vibrant legacy.

For more than 1500 years it was the capital of three empires: Roman, Byzantine and the Ottoman Empires. It was beautified accordingly with magnificent monuments and became a metropolis where diverse cultures, nations and religions mingled. Those cultures, nations and religions are the small pieces that form the mosaic of Istanbul.





Istanbul is the only city in the world built on two continents and divided by sea.



With one arm reaching out to Asia and the other to Europe, Istanbul is the only city in the world built on two continents. The Bosphorus courses the waters of the Black Sea, the Sea of Marmara and the Golden Horn through the city's heart.

The most magnificent of Istanbul's monuments are clustered on the historical peninsula, the triangular piece of land surrounded by the Sea of Marmara to the east and south, by the Golden Horn to the north and by the city walls to the west.

The Historic Areas of Istanbul was inscribed on the World Heritage List of UNESCO in 1985, enchanting visitors with an impressive texture. Sultanahmet Square is the core of the historical peninsula and the most prominent examples of Byzantine and Ottoman architecture can be seen as close proximity here.

During the Byzantine Period the centre of the city was the Hippodrome and its environs. The Palace was the centre of power, the Hagia Sophia (Ayasofya) the most spectacular of the religious buildings; the Hippodrome served as the common entertainment centre and the Yerebatan Sarnıcı (Basilica Cistern) supplied most of the city's water, — all are to be found at the centre of the city. During Ottoman times, the square where the Hippodrome once stood became the site for the circumcision ceremonies of the Sultans' sons.

The Historic Areas of Istanbul, inscribed in the World Heritage List in 1985, cover four main areas: the Archaeological Park, the Süleymaniye Mosque and its associated Conservation Zeyrek Mosque and its associated Conservation Area, and the City Walls of Istanbul. In its evaluation report the International Council on Monuments and Sites has stated that one cannot conceive of the World Heritage List without Istanbul, which has been associated with the world's major political, religious and artistic events for over 2000 years. The cultural property in this area includes unique monuments and masterpieces of universal architecture, two of which are the Hagia Sophia (Ayasofya), built by Anthemios of Tralles and Isidoros of Milet in 532-537, and the Süleymaniye Mosque; a masterpiece of Sinan the Great Architect.





Modern Shopping Center

 $oldsymbol{I}$ stanbul's shopping variety with its traditional and modern products makes the city an attraction center. The city provides various choices between Ottoman Empire originated historical bazaars and modern shopping malls. Fabulous Turkish carpets made of silk, wool or cotton; precious jewelleries, authentic glasswares, traditional evil eye souvenirs and haute couture, trendy and creative products... The city has multiple shopping areas reflecting every era's characteristic traits. With its more than 4000 shops, the magnificent Grand Bazaar (Kapalıçarşı) is one of the world's greatest historical malls. Egyptian Bazaar (Mısır Çarşısı) is where various spices, dried fruits, basketry, jewelry, drapery and haberdashery is sold. With its craftsmen Sultanahmet is the place for those who want to enjoy the mysterious ambiance of the Ottoman era. The Arasta Bazaar with its jewellery, pottery, spice, textiles and carpet shops and the Antique Books Market with its priceless books is for the history passionates. For a real İstanbul experience, street markets which called, Salı Pazarı (Tuesday) in Kadıköy on the Asian Side, Ulus Pazarı (Friday) in Ulus and Cumartesi Pazarı (Saturday) in Beşiktaş are all worth to visit. Taksim is a grand shopping area with loads of bia brands located on and around the main Istiklal Street. The two kilometer long street has many neo-classical passages that include various types of shops from vintage clothing to hand made ceramics. Also these passages have 100 year old traditional shops and many cafes. Şişhane, Karakoy and Čihangir near Taksim are filled with designer and vintage stores and bookshops. Nişantaşı is famous with brands and local designer clothing shops. Bagdat Street on the Anatolian side is also a crowded place for shopping lovers.





Modern Shopping Center

Other than historical and street markets Istanbul has almost 200 modern shopping malls. Located in Levent district; Kanyon, Metrocity, Özdilek and Akmerkez are prominent malls. Istinye Park in Maslak offers an outstanding open air experience. Cevahir Istanbul in Mecidiyeköy is one of the biggest malls in the world. Capacity and Aqua Florya are close to the Atatürk Airport. Capitol in Altunizade district, Palladium and Brandium in Ataşehir district and Nautilus in Kadıköy district and Viaport next to Sabiha Gokcen International Airport are in the Anatolian side.



İstanbul Airport

The first phase of the Istanbul Airport, which is the largest infrastructure project in the history of the Turkish Republic, opened for service on October 29, 2018; since April 6th 2019, the airport is operational with all units and at full capacity. Covering an area of 76,5 million square meters, the new airport serves as a global hub between Asia, Africa and Europe.

Istanbul Airport has been honored with one of Global Traveler's Leisure Lifestyle awards in the 'Outstanding Innovation' category. The publication, which is among the most prestigious in the global tourism sector, picked Istanbul Airport for its 'Special Achievement Award'. Once all phases of the airport are operational, the facility is expected to achieve a capacity of 200 million passengers.





PUBLIC TRANSPORT

 $oldsymbol{H}$ avaist, IETT and Istanbul Seyahat offer services to passengers who are looking to access Istanbul Airport via public transportation. Havaist carries out luxury passenger and luggage transportation services on 12 different lines, 44 stations. Ensuring full time city integration from Istanbul Airport, Havaist organizes two-way bus services with 15 minute and 90 minute intervals. IETT, on the other hand, provides services on its Halkalı, Mahmutbey, Mecidiyeköy, Atatürk Airport, Mescid-i Selam and Alibeyköy Bus Terminal lines. Istanbul Seyahat offers scheduled intercity trips between the airport and Çorlu-Tekirdağ.



TAXI

Taxi service is offered at the Istanbul Airport 24/7, thereby covering both flight times as well as all periods outside of flight schedules. Three types of taxis are utilized for this service, comprised of black "E" type, blue "D" type, and orange "C" type taxis. Passengers wishing to benefit from Taxi service may use the vehicles located on the departure floor (2nd floor) in addition to those at the main stops in front of the Domestic and International Passenger exits in Plaza section.



IGA BUGGY

There are 3 different Buggy stops on international departure flights. They are separated as; Northern, Eastern, and Western stops. There is a separate line located on the domestic departure line which has a designated stop in itself. The Buggy shuttle service can be purchased on its own as offered under iGA Pass packages. To take advantage of the service, you can visit Buggy stops which you can find by checking the map on Istanbul Airport application. (Searching as Buagu on the map will suffice.)

- Western Buggy Stop is designated to A, B, C, E, and F international gates.
- Northern Buggy Stop is designated to D international gate.
- Eastern Buggy Stop is designated to A, B, C, E and F international gates.
- Domestic Buggy Stop is designated to domestic flight gates.
- You can check your gate from your boarding pass for the corresponding buggy stop

 $oldsymbol{I}$ stanbulSabihaGökçenInternational Airport Investment Development and Operation Inc.(ISĜ), company founded in partnership by Limak Holding (LIMAK), GMR Infrastructure Limited (GMR), and Malaysia Airports Holdings Berhad (MAHB), has 20 years operation rights, as of May 1st of 2008, of Istanbul Sabiha Gökçen International Airport, including the management of the terminal buildings, car park, ground handling, cargo and aircraft refueling operations, the airport hotel and CIP facilities.





The features and the services that is provided that the new terminal building and its complementaries provide include;

- 128 check-in and self service check-in kiosks;
- a total of 74 passport counters for incoming and outgoing passengers;
- 5.000 sq m food court for cafés and restaurants belonging to the leading food & beverage brands.
- 4.500 sq m Duty Free shopping area is run by SETUR and occupies a space of 3.300 sq m and 1.200 sq m in the departures and arrivals halls respectively. Other than the usual duty free shopping items, such as local/foreign drinks, tobacco and cosmetics; especially ready-wear, textile accessories and electronics is offered for sale.

- 3 apron viewing lounges and CIP halls;
- A two-storey VIP building with terminal connection;
- 400 sq m conference center;
- A four storey car park with a capacity of about 4,718 vehicles & 72 buses (3.836 indoors and 882 + 72 bus outdoors)
- A three storey airport hotel with 128 rooms, adjacent to the terminal and with separate entrances at air and ground sides.
- Multi aircraft parking system, allowing synchronized service to 8 aircrafts with large fuselages (IATA code E) or 16 middle sized fuselage aircrafts (IATA code C);
- EDS (Explosives Detection Systems) baggage screening.









HAVABUS

With HAVABUS Shuttles you can travel to and from Sabiha Gökçen Airport, to Kadıköy and Taksim.

The shuttles are white colored and parked in front of the terminal building arrivals level exit ready to take you to Taksim for a fee of 15 TL and to Kadıköy for a fee of 10 TL. Shuttle's Taksim departure point is across Taksim Divan hotel, in front of the Point Hotel. Kadıköy departure point is the pier.

Shuttles work between 03:30 am and 01:00 am hours.

Getting Around

BUS & METROBUS

Frequently used all around the city, buses are economic means of transport. The private laned express bus service "Metrobus" carries thousands of commuters daily; provides fast and comfortable transportation between the two ends of Asian side and the European side. SUBWAY & TRAM

İstanbul's subway and the tram system have a wide network and provide easy access to your desired point both in Asian and European sides. İstanbul's subway operates from Hacıosman to Yenikapi (M2); from Aksaray — Atatürk Airport to Kirazlı (M1) and from Kirazlı to Olimpiyatköy (M3) on the European side. Also subway runs from Kadıköy to Kartal (M4) on the Asian Side. The tramline operates from Bağcılar to Kabataş (T1), Habibler to Topkapı (T4), Kabataş to Taksim (F1). There

is also a funicular system that runs between Kabataş and Taksim (F1).


MARMARAY

The dream of connecting the two continents under the sea has come true in February 2014 with Marmaray in Istanbul. The "Marmaray Train System" is a 76 kilometers tube tunnel that enables passengers to pass under the Marmara inner sea with train in only a couple of minutes. Between the last stops; Kazliçeşme in European side and Ayrılık Çeşmesi in Asian side, one can enjoy the travelling of changing continents. Kazlicesme stop is 10 kilometers to the Atatürk International Airport and from the Yenikapi stop (also in European side) there are sea busses to cities in the south of İstanbul.


Subway - Metro Map





FERRY AND SEA BUS

To see historical sides of the city and travel fast between Europe and Asia, one of the best options would be ferries with an incredible sightseeing opportunity. There are many ferry and sea-bus stations connecting the Bosphorus shores, Golden Horn, Prince's Islands and other areas. "Vapur" (big ferries) connect the main areas with each ferry leaving in 30 min. or 45 min. from 07:00 am until 11:00 pm. The small ferries of operate with smaller boats departing every 5- 15 min. There are also sea-bus routes that enables public transportation from İstanbul to main areas within the city limits and/ or the cities around the Marmara Sea.

S NEXT IS ACCOMMODATION





Contemporary hotel management in Istanbul started in the second half of the 19th century, as the Orient Express extended its non-stop service from Paris to Istanbul on 1 June 1889 (with Istanbul becoming one of the two original endpoints of the timetabled service of the Orient Express) and the city became, as a result, a tourist destination. In 1892, a group of local investors, in partnership with the Wagons-Lits company, opened Hotel Pera Palace in Beyoglu district, which was designed by the famous Levantine architect of Istanbul, Alexander Vallaury. Also in 1892, The Grand Hotel de Londres was opened by two local partners, L. Adamopoulos and N. Aperghis, in the place of the former residence of the Glavany family in Beyoğlu.[1] Shortly afterwards, a series of hotels, including Bristol Hotel (1893) and "Hotel M. Tokatlıyan" (1897), were opened in the same district.

Very possible accommodation style is available in Istanbul, from the hostel dormitories and mid-range hotels to the world-class luxury hotels. Although reasonable compared to the European standards, the rates are more expensive than in the rest of the country.

While the majority of the 5-star hotels concentrate within modern districts like Beyoğlu, Şişli and Beşiktaş, the 4-star hotels are generally located within the historical peninsula. The majority of hotels generally vicinity congregate in the Sulťanăhmet and Hagia Sŏphiă. Numerous hotels occupying historical buildings are situated in this district. Budget hotels are generally found in, both, modern and historical districts. At the end of 2010, according to the data of the Association of the Touristic Hotels and Investors Touristic Hotels and Investors (TUROB) of the Republic of Turkey, 766 accommodation establishments of different categories in Istanbul (licensed by the Ministry of Tourism and Culture of Turkey and/or the municipality of Istanbul) had the total of 46,652 rooms and 93,299 beds.[8] That capacity alone was sufficient to accommodate the annual volume of 10 million tourists.

At the same time, another 51 new hotels (of which 25 were 5-star hotels) were at various stages of development at the end of 2010, soon to add another 9,512 rooms and 19,800 beds to the already existing capacity. With the completion of these new hotels, Istanbul's accommodation capacity will have reached, within a few years, the total of 817 hotels, 56,164 rooms and 113,99 beds.



Şile - Ağva






Sapanca

Just above Sapanca, 115 kilometers from İstanbul, Kartepe ski-resort makes Sapanca an attraction center during winter. The village is very famous with wellness-Spa hotels.





İznik

Located kilometers 137 from İstanbul on the east of Bursa in Eastern Marmara, İznik is a historical town once served as the capital of the Byzantine Empire and also an important place to visit for Christians. Hagia Sophia Church, Mosaics of Jesus, Mary and John the Baptist, Nilüfer Hatun Soup Kitchen, the Green Mosque, İznik Church and Church of Zoimesis are few of the many historical places of the city. İznik is also the center of tile (Çini) and ceramics production since the 15th century.





Edirne

Located 240 kilometers from İstanbul in the west of Turkey, Edirne is the one of the former capitals of Ottoman Empire. The symbol of the city is "Selimiye Mosque"; a masterpiece of the Great Architect Sinan's and the complex of Sultan Bayezid II, the Health Museum. Besides, the traditional Turkish sport oil wrestling from early times of the Ottoman Empire is originated from Edirne.





Bursa

Located 155 kilometers from İstanbul in the west of Turkey, Industrial sprawl makes a mockery of its moniker 'Yeşil Bursa' ('Green Bursa'), but the big city bustle doesn't detract from Bursa's historic allure. Awarded Unesco World Heritage status in 2014 for being the birthplace of the Ottoman Empire, the city is built around the mosques, mausoleums and monuments from its grand epoch as the Ottoman capital. After admiring architectural finery and getting lost amid the push and shove of the bazaar crowds, it's time to partake in Bursa's culinary contribution to the world. This is the home of İskender kebap (or Bursa kebap; döner kebap on fresh pide topped with tomato sauce and browned butter) and trust us, you haven't tasted how good it can

be until you've had the real deal here. Afterwards, balance out the butter-soaked decadence with some fresh air and a zoom up to Uludağ (Turkey's premier ski resort) on theworld's longest cable car.
